Susan Watson named L.A. County Teacher of the Year

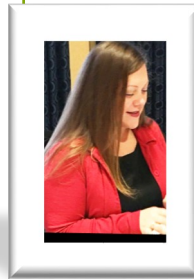
Our own Susan Watson, teacher of Japanese and CLTA affiliate representative to the Board from MCLASC (Modern and Classical Language Association of Southern California), was named L.A. County Teacher of the Year on September 16. Susan has been teaching for 20 years and is at Long Beach Polytechnic High School in the Long Beach Unified School District. Susan was one of only 16 teachers chosen from the region.

According to the online news announcement, "Susan's high school students learn about math, history, English grammar, even science--all in Japanese. And she reassures parents who worry they can't help with homework, explaining that if she does her job correctly, the students won't need their help." A parent noted that "All of Ms. Watson's time and effort have inspired our daughter to love the Japanese language and culture."

Intriguing News from Global Navigator and CIEE

NEW CLTA/CIEE Student of the Year Award coming this Fall

In a mission to recognize student achievement in language learning, to elevate the importance of communicative and experiential language learning, and to provide exceptional experiences for exceptional students, CLTA will be partnering with CIEE to honor students who excel in learning a world language and to acknowledge the teachers who teach them. This Language **Student of the Year Award** will provide world language teachers in California an opportunity to put forth the endeavors of their best students, highlighting their own endeavors as well. The runners-up, and the winner will all become Global Navigator Students by being awarded incremental scholarships for CIEE Summer High School Abroad Language and Culture programs, and the winner will be honored at the annual CLTA conference. CIEE High School Summer Abroad programs integrate ACTFL and California World Language Content Standards into the immersive environment of a four-week program in one of seven languages. Full details will be available for the CLTA Summer Seminar in July 2017.

Student World/Study Travel Scholarships

CIEE (Council on International Education Exchange) has been partnering with schools across CA and the U.S. over the last three years to provide exciting and very substantial scholarship funding for students to participate in Summer Abroad Experiences (<https://www.ciee.org/high-school-summer-abroad/>) to supplement

public high school language proficiency and global competency objectives. **For summer 2017 - 5+ million dollars in scholarships have been awarded to over 1,000 students to travel.**

For 2017-2018 CIEE anticipates adding another 8 partner schools in CA, working with a private donor who has committed very substantial funds for students to travel abroad exclusively through CIEE.
